

April 2020 Update:

AT&T handled the hanging line from the Clipper/Moonraker bridge bright and early this morning.

During the construction of the Clipper/Moonraker bridge, signs were placed to reroute traffic. Residents have been asking that the signs that have been in place along Moonraker Dr. be removed. I inquired about those signs in January, and again in March. Both times the parish indicated that the job of removing them would be handled, but as of today, that job remains incomplete. I asked that the striping on the Clipper/Moonraker bridge be corrected, but so far, nothing. I will keep after this matter until the job is completed.

Please note the progress toward the back of Moonraker Dr. sections of our street have been torn up or are in the process of repair. This, of course, is the best that can be done until it is Moonraker's turn in the cue to be replaced. Again, our homeowner's organization DOES work for our residents. I have been begging for repair or replacement since 2017. The cane has been cut at the second curve. Please help to keep it cut.

I realize the virus has affected all of us in various ways. The job of seeing that Moonraker Island gets what it needs is endless. If you have time on your hands, I can surely use some help.
